Your RYLA candidate today may well be your Rotary Club President in the future!

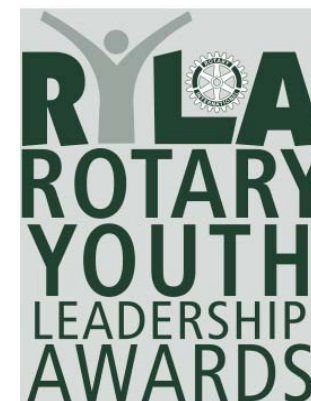
