Paul Harris Fellow- Annual Selection Process

The Paul Harris Fellowship is named for Paul Harris, who founded Rotary with three business associates in Chicago in 1905. The Fellowship was established in his honour, in 1975, to express appreciation to individuals who have contributed US \$1000.00 to the humanitarian and education programs of the Rotary Foundation. These programs include a range of projects that save and invigorate the lives of people around the world and enhance international friendships and understanding. Rotarian can also designate a Paul Harris Fellow to recognize another person whose life demonstrates a shared purpose with the objectives and mission and of the Rotary Foundation to build world understanding and peace.

In 2007, Toronto Eglinton Rotary Club decided to recognize the meritorious work two individuals each year whose work demonstrates the objectives of The Rotary Foundation. Funds will be allocated each year from the Foundation of the Rotary Club of Toronto Eglinton for this purpose. The award will be presented in the spring of each year.

A member of the club will nominate candidates for the award. A committee of three members, appointed by the Board of Directors will make the selection of the recipients. A formal presentation of the award will be made in June of each year.

Nominees for the award may be members of the Toronto Eglinton Rotary Club or the community at large whose life exemplifies the humanitarian and educational objectives of The Rotary Foundation.

Nomination forms will be distributed by the President of the TERC in April of each year with the selection made in May.
